PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentences)				

This course covers research of origin, content, and contemporary development of norms governing international turn-over of goods, services and money, for the purpose of gaining scientific competences and academic skills, develop creative thinking skills and learning practical skills in International Trade Law. The course also encompasses analysis of legal and political origin of International Trade Law norms and its relationship with the aims of these norms. This approach enables students to become competent to apply and interpret norms and principles underlying International Trade Law.
