Youth Leadership Group (YLG) Rationale

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) is an independent, non-governmental international organization with a membership of 169 national standards bodies from around the world. ISO brings together experts to share knowledge and develop voluntary, consensusbased, market relevant International Standards that support innovation and provide solutions to global challenges.

The ISO Environmental Management Technical Committee (ISO/TC 207) develops standards in the field of environmental management to address environmental and climate impacts in support of sustainable development. The Standards Council of Canada holds the Secretariat of the ISO Environmental Management technical committee.

Instigating a cultural change that engages all ISO stakeholders around diversity and inclusivity and encourages broad participation in ISO standards development and governance by underrepresented groups (including the next generation of experts) is a priority articulated in the ISO - Strategy 2030.

The <u>ISO/TC 207 Strategic Business Plan</u> mirrors this priority with a commitment to ensuring diversity, including geographic, gender and generational diversity. It is with this intent that the ISO Environmental Management Executive Team launches a global call for applicants for the **ISO Environmental Management Youth Leadership Group**.

The Youth Leadership Group will be appointed for a term of one year.

How to be a part of the change

Who can apply?

You must be between the ages of 18 and 25 at the time of application and be currently enrolled in a post-secondary educational institution.

How will successful applicants be chosen?

Advancing sustainability cuts across disciplines. Our work at the ISO Environmental Management Technical Committee requires technical experts, but also expertise in finance, communications and marketing, law and policy-making, graphics design, and education, amongst other disciplines. Our stakeholders speak multiple languages including English, French, Russian, Spanish, Mandarin and Arabic.

We are looking to create the strongest possible Youth Leadership Group with the right mix of linguistic diversity, geographic diversity, gender diversity, and diversity in skills and experience. This will make make the YLG a powerful driver of change. We are also looking for candidates that are passionate about driving environmental progress through standardization. As a result, we don't have a preset notion of who the ideal candidate is. Our objective is to have the right overall mix of candidates to form the YLG.

Short-listed applicants will be interviewed by the ISO/TC 207 Executive Team over March 2024.

How much of a time commitment do I need to give?

We recognize that availability of time fluctuates based on school, work and family life. We are looking for individuals that can commit to approximately 10 hours per week, but recognize that flexibility will be required on how participants engage in YLG.
